December 21, 2025: Fourth Sunday of Advent



"The Lord himself will give you a sign."

Today, the Sunday before Christmas, the Church teaches us who we are and where we come from. It is a teaching about Jesus himself, about who he is. Matthew has begun his Gospel story with a genealogy, a family tree, to show us the blood line of Jesus. It is a story of Mary and Joseph, and of a surprise pregnancy. The birth of Jesus is the most important sign given by God. This child is the fruit of the Holy Spirit. He is son of Mary and Son of God. With this understanding, Joseph makes a home for mother

and child. St. Paul, in the second reading, tells us that this message must be passed on to the whole world. Once you know he has come to live among us, the way you view your life can never be the same. Let's make room for Christ in our hearts this Christmas, and when he arrives we will sing for joy knowing God has come close!

<u>Marriage Tip</u> – During this Christmas season, as we celebrate the birth of Jesus, let us remember to cherish our humanity. Christ honoured us by humbly sharing our human condition. Today, grant yourself and your spouse the right to simply be human: accept imperfections, laughter, and even mistakes. That is where true love lies.

Stewardship Reflection — "When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home." (Matthew 1.24) Putting our complete trust in the Lord without expecting anything in return. Striving to put God first in all things and follow Him wherever He may lead us. Joseph was a model of these pillars of our faith. As we prepare for the birth of our Lord, pray for the strength and courage to be a model of discipleship, just as Joseph was.

<u>Did You Know?</u> – Christmas cards became popular in the 19th century. The first one was designed by John Calcot Horsley in 1843. It had religious pictures of Christ's birth but also a seasonal greeting and message.
