"If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."

Today's Gospel offers a proud rich man whose spiritual awareness is closed to the needs of the poor man, Lazarus. He has become locked in a life of ease. For all the good he might have done, the rich man's love of money made him morally unresponsive. In this parable, Jesus makes it clear that we have the spiritual help we need to resist the temptation of pride. There are the words of the prophet Amos warning that wealth tempts people to think only of themselves. More importantly, through the Ten Commandments, we are

directed to respond righteously to others, especially the poor. Not surprisingly, then, Father Abraham rebukes the rich man with the powerful truth, telling him these spiritual laws and instructions are the firm basis on which to seek salvation. And with Jesus, we learn that to reduce the suffering of others by our acts of compassion is a fitting response to God's splendid gift of love for all humanity.

Stewardship Reflection – When God created the world, He declared that it was good and He gave it to all humankind for us to enjoy. However, over the years we have created a chasm between those who have great gifts and those who do not. In today's Gospel, we see that with our own stewardship, we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little.

Did You Know? – Why are there 3 steps before our church sanctuary? (continued from last week) Holiness requires ascent! God told Moses: "Take off your sandals, for the place where you stand is holy ground." (Exodus 3.5) In Scripture, we never descend into God's presence, we ascend. The three steps leading to the altar remind us: You don't casually stroll into sacred space. You climb. You prepare. You rise. They symbolize your soul leaving behind the ordinary and moving toward the sacred.
