From September 17 to 29, Louise Normandeau traveled throughout the diocese to present Carlo Acutis, the saint of young people and internet users. The Quebec native worked tirelessly to give 24 presentations on the young man who was canonized on September 7. She visited three schools, five retirement homes, and 17 parishes, sometimes two or three times apiece, speaking to different age groups. All this to highlight the ardent faith of the young Italian who was buried in sneakers for Christ and his enthusiasm for Eucharistic miracles. 


REMINDER Guiding Our Children in Truth and Love - October 24, 2025

NEW Christian Meditation Day - November 15, 2025





NEW Creation of the Manitoba Institute to Combat Antisemitism

Antisemitism in Canada today is more pervasive and aggressive than ever before. A July 22, 2025 Statistics Canada report on crime notes that in 2024, Jewish people were the group most targeted by hate crimes in the country. Almost 19%, or 920, of the nearly 4,900 reported hate crimes and almost 70% of religiously motivated hate crimes were against Jewish people - even though they make up only 0.9% of the population. The Asper Foundation and the Jewish Heritage Centre of Western Canada announce the creation of the Manitoba Institute to Combat Antisemitism, an action-oriented education-centered weapon against hate.

The Institute offers customized training for students, educators, non-profit organizations, businesses and professional groups to educate participants about the genesis and evolution of antisemitism—and how to fight it.



Belle Jarniewski, Executive Director of the Jewish Heritage Centre of Western Canada, will lead the Institute. Belle was appointed to Canada's delegation to the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) by the federal government in 2013 and serves on the Education Working Group and the Committee on Antisemitism and Holocaust Denial. A University of Manitoba Gold Medalist in the Faculty of Education, Belle has taught thousands of Manitoba students and educators about the Holocaust and antisemitism since 2010. She has also led training sessions for professionals in law, medicine, and law enforcement, including the Winnipeg Police Service.

The Manitoba Institute to Combat Antisemitism is now available to deliver this essential service to any group seeking to understand and counter the scourge of antisemitism.



News From the CCCB

NEW 2025 CCCB Plenary Assembly Meeting Video Library by Salt + Light

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) held its annual meeting of the Plenary Assembly from 22-26 September 2025 at the at the Sheraton Montreal Airport Hotel.

This year, Salt + Light Television, a Canadian Catholic TV network, produced daily recap videos of the Plenary Assembly meeting. These videos summarize, in a dynamic way, the discussions from each day's plenary session, including commentary from Bishops and, occasionally, experts who were invited to present on special topics. The CCCB welcomes the sharing of these videos, as broadly as possible, in an effort to keep the faithful informed about the work of the Bishops last week.



Day 1 of the CCCB plenary meeting: September 22
