"Your Faith Has Made You Well!"

In today's readings, Naaman the Syrian and the ten lepers received God's personal attention. Naaman was so grateful that he was willing to offer a great gift in return for God's care. The leper shared the same attitude of thanksgiving as Naaman. Both were outsiders, not Jews; little was expected of them, but both did not take their gift for granted. Their attitudes of thanksgiving was a sign of deeper healing: they had been touched by God in a profound way, they were made whole in a way that was not skin-deep. Their faith healed them, their hopelessness was turned to thanksgiving! Do we realize that God cares for us, right here, right now? Do we

stop to give thanks for God's personal attention in our lives? Today, at Eucharist, itself a prayer of thanksgiving and praise, we have the perfect opportunity to say, "Thank you." As we go forth from this celebration, we can continue to express gratitude to God who loves us deeply and personally.
