<u>Did You Know?</u> – Why are there 3 steps before our church sanctuary? In St. Hyacinthe Church and in many older Catholic churches, the 3 steps are not without meaning. They represent the Trinity: step 1, God the Father, source of all; step 2, God the Son, Word made flesh; step 3, God the Holy Spirit, who sanctifies. The sanctuary is not just a stage. It's a meeting place between Heaven and Earth, and the 3 steps are the path into that divine mystery.
