NEW A Happy and Holy New Year 2026!

For the second year running, Bishop LeGatt has brought to life the good old European Catholic tradition of blessing homes in the new year on Epiphany, using blessed chalk, to bring encouragement and blessings to families in the new year. Epiphany is traditionally celebrated on the 12th day of Christmas, i.e. January 6.

The Catholic tradition of marking one's home with chalk on Epiphany to signify that Christ is alive in our home dates back many centuries. So, on January 6, Bishop LeGatt blessed the Diocesan Center, accompanied by several members of the diocesan staff.

With the blessing of the chalk, we ask the Lord to bless our home, all those who live here and all the guests who will enter through the door in the course of the year. The ceremony of blessing the house and inscribing the initials of the three Magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar) above each door, can be performed by family members (or a priest) and can become a beautiful annual family tradition. The letters "20 + C + M + B + 26" also stand for *Christus Mansionem Benedictat*, Latin for "May the Lord bless this house".





As the Apostle Paul asserts in his letter to the Ephesians, "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling" (4:4). This Bible verse, chosen for the 2026 Week of Prayer, encapsulates the theological depth of Christian unity.

NEW 2026 Pro-Life Boot Camp – March 30 to April 1, 2026

[Registration](#) is open for CCBR's 2026 Winnipeg Pro-life Bootcamp for high school students! Bootcamp consists in daily apologetics trainings, street outreach, and fun social time for the students!

This year's bootcamp runs March 30th to April 1st (three full days) during the spring break and will conclude with a family dinner on the last day to which all participants and their families will be invited. Most of the Bootcamp will *likely* be at Immanuel Christian School, with some of it *likely* being run at Youth For Christ in downtown Winnipeg.

Early Bird Deadline is January 17th and priced at \$175 per student (that includes meals, training, travel during camp, and chaperoned hotels).

Note: A Change from Previous Bootcamps

Some parents and teens might be interested to know that this year we are pivoting in our street outreach plans for the Bootcamp. After two excellent years of outreach at the University of Manitoba, the university students began to organize belligerent counterprotests and that meant our third Bootcamp last year was extra difficult for the bootcampers - they did so well, but the outreach environment was unideal for their learning, in my opinion. Some teens loved the battle vibes. Others found it a bit overwhelming, so we are going to change it up this year.

For 2026, we are going to have the Bootcamp street outreach take place *off* campus - with the hope to have it return to campus in future years - this year's outreach will be *mostly* door-to-door conversations, in residential areas, in trios (each trio including a CCBR mentor). Our team has extensive experience door-knocking and we know this will be pretty relaxed outreach.

However, on the Thursday *after* the Bootcamp (April 2nd) there will be *optional* outreach on the campus for any bootcamper that wants to join (I know some would love to go to campus - so I want to present an optional opportunity for those interested).
