Marriage Tip for Christmas – Christmas is the celebration of God assuming human nature. Our own human nature, however, often exposes family conflicts during this season. Accept the human foibles of your spouse and relatives.

Marriage Tip for the New Year – Make a "spiritual New Year's resolution" together. Choose one thing to stick to through this year as a family: monthly Confession, praying together, Adoration, etc. You can "adopt" a patron saint for the coming year to intercede for you and your family. Throughout the year, read a biography about them, attend Mass together on the saint's feast day, and find litanies, novenas, other prayers to pray together.



Blessing Children on New Year's Day – Dear parents, you are encouraged to take a moment on the first day of 2026 to bless your children, in your own words or with this prayer:

"May God bless you and may He keep your hearts and minds filled with Joy – in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

Did You Know? – The use of "Holly" (holly tree) as a religious tradition and Christmas decoration began in northern Europe. It symbolizes protection, eternal life and Christ's sacrifice with its red berries and prickly thorns.
