***NEW* The Good Shepherd Campaign 2025 – For the Life of the Church!**

During this second week of the 2025 Good Shepherd Campaign, For the Life of the Church!, we invite you to visit the [Archdiocese's website](#) to watch [the video of Archbishop LeGat and three of our seminarians](#). The cost to support a seminarian is about \$ 50,000 per year. This includes accommodation and food, tuition, medical insurance and a monthly stipend. For international seminarians, it is also a question of legal fees and travel costs to bring them from abroad. At least twice during their studies, we pay for a trip home to see his family.

The cost to bring in an international priest is about \$ 20,000. This includes legal fees, travel costs, two and a half months' salary paid by the Archdiocese during his enculturation, language classes is needed, and an allowance for him to purchase warm clothing for his first winter here.

We invite you to *discern in prayer* to support the **2025 Good Shepherd Campaign**, because priests play a vital role *in the Life of the Church*. It is important that we continue to support seminarians and international priests in their vocations.

We invite you to pray for our seminarians as they continue to discern God's will in their lives and their journey toward the priesthood.

Please note that the collection for the Good Shepherd Campaign will take place on the weekend of November 15 and 16.

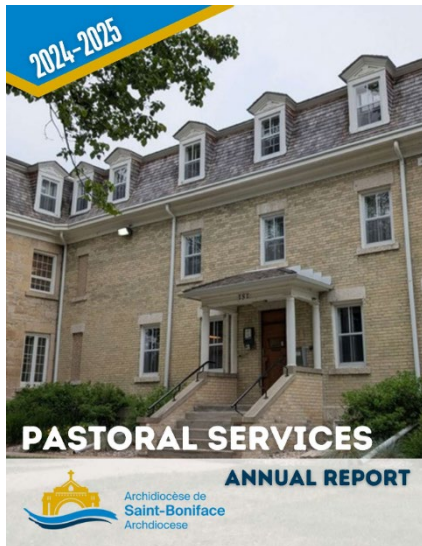
