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November 9, 2025: Dedication of the Lateran Basilica



“Stop making my Father’s house a marketplace!”

As Jesus enters the temple courts, he is met with a bustling scene of merchants selling cattle, sheep, and doves for sacrifices, as well as money changers exchanging currency. The temple, the center of Jewish worship, is crowded with people from all over, coming to offer sacrifices and fulfill their religious duties. Jesus cleanses the temple of all the merchants and money changers, restoring the temple to a place of reverence and worship and speaks about the destruction of the temple. This carries a deep spiritual meaning, indicating that the true place of worship and connection with God is not a physical building, but within ourselves. Jesus is showing that he is the new temple, the ultimate connection between humanity and God. It’s a powerful reminder that God’s presence is not confined to a specific location but rather resides within each one of us. When we understand this concept,

we realize that **true worship is more than just rituals and traditions; it is about recognizing and honouring the divine spark within ourselves and others.** Jesus cleansing the temple is a profound symbol of purity and renewal, inviting us to reflect on our own inner temples and how we can keep them pure and holy.

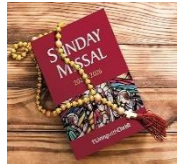

Did You Know? – *Why do we celebrate a feast day of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica?* The Lateran Basilica in Rome, Italy is considered the Mother Church of all churches. It is the home church of the Pope. The act of dedicating a place to God is a ritual found in most religious traditions.
