“The glory of the Lord will appear above you.”

Today's feast invites us to join the Magi, and to become wise travellers in life. We are called to go on the journey. Like the Wise Men of old, we are to search for the Child, and adore when we find Him. For as long as we are on this earth, may we journey faithfully. Saint Peter, who spent many a day in the Lord's company, was never finished with learning. Indeed, there is always so much to discover. **“The truth I have now come to realise,”** Peter said on one famous occasion, **“is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.”** This is the challenge of today's feast – that we go out and embrace life, and to be grateful for the gift of Jesus our Saviour. In Him, God reveals to us insights into our own lives that change us, just as the Magi were transformed by their journey to Bethlehem.

Marriage Tip – Come and meet the baby Jesus. His kingdom is founded on love and mercy, in humility and service. As you meet the Immanuel, God-with-us, may you, like the Magi, be filled with great joy, gratitude, and praise for the wonderful things God has done for you.

Stewardship – “*They opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.*” (Matt. 2.11) The image of the Magi kneeling before the infant Jesus and opening their treasure chests for Him is an image that we should all try to follow each day. In gratitude for all that we have been given, we are called to generously share all our gifts, not just the ones we pick and choose. God wants us to be generous with everything, but especially with that one thing that means the most to you.

Did You Know? – The Magi paid homage to the Child Jesus by offering precious gifts. These gifts symbolize what we too have to offer. **Frankincense** represents the worship we give to the Son of God born of Mary, enthroning him at the centre of our lives. **Myrrh** represents the cross which each of us is called to accept if we are to follow Christ, denying ourselves and following his way of love. The **gold** we bring is to acknowledge his kingship. It is our commitment to work for his kingdom and his values. Being wise men and women guided by faith, we endeavour to ensure that those who live in poverty, or who are powerless in our world, may find God revealing his very self in humanity.
