### \*NEW\* 2023 Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada - September 27-28, 2025

The Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada will take place on September 27 and 28. Each year, and with the generosity of Catholic faithful from coast to coast to coast, the Bishops of Canada continue their work on important doctrinal and ethical questions; ecumenical initiatives and interreligious dialogue; international relations; evangelization, faith education and catechesis; relations with Indigenous peoples; questions of social justice; and the development of a culture of life and family. In addition to their national Conference, the Bishops of Canada also meet in four Regional Assemblies (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West). The main purpose of the collection is to help the bishops pay their annual diocesan dues to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), as well as any annual financial contribution to their regional episcopal assembly. In addition, any extra amounts collected can be used by the diocese for its own pastoral needs, although some bishops choose to give these extra amounts to the CCCB as a donation. You will find envelopes for this collection in your parishes.



### \*NEW\* Holy Cross Parish a Jubilee Site for Two Days – September 24 & 12, 2025

Holy Cross Parish has been decreed am a Jubilee Site for the Jubilee Year for two days, to mark the occasion of its patronal feast, The Exaltation of the Holy Cross, on September 13 and 14, 2025.

"The action of travelling to the Jubilee sites of the Archdiocese is a tangible sign of expressing our lifelong walk with Jesus, our Redeemer and our Saviour. Such a pilgrimage is marked by being attentive and open to God's Word, marked by prayer, repentance and reconciliation, marked by the celebration of the Eucharist and by a renewed commitment to live out more fully charity and love.

A Jubilee Indulgence is available to all Catholics who devoutly visit the site, to participate in Mass, a liturgy of the Word, a penitential celebration (with individual confession), or to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, the Way of the Cross, or the Rosary. The usual conditions of indulgences also apply (avoid all mortal and venial sin; pray the Creed, the Our Father, and a prayer for the intentions of the Pope; and to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist several days before or after)." #### \*NEW\* 2025 Diocesan Study Days - October 24 or 25, 2025

This year's theme for Saint-Boniface's Diocesan Study Days is **Sexuality and Identity: Catholic Pastoral Accompaniment.** Listen to presentations by:

- Fr. Kevin Belgrave, professor at St. Augustine Seminary in Toronto who teaches on bioethics, foundations of moral theology, human sexuality, and Catholic social teachings. He'll be speaking to us about the Catholic anthropology of human sexuality.
- Dr. Julia Sadusky, clinical psychiatrist from Colorado who offers individual, family, and couples therapy in addition to consultations for individuals and families around sexuality and gender, and author of Start Talking to Your Kids about Sex: A Practical Guide for Catholics and Talking with Your Teen about Sex: A Practical Guide for Catholics.
- Deacon Gilles Urquhart, permanent deacon for the Archdiocese of Saint-Boniface and chaplain for Courage, which offers pastoral support in the form of spiritual guidance, community prayer support, and fellowship for those who experience same-sex attraction. He is also chaplain for EnCourage, an apostolate that helps its members work together to understand the experiences of their loved ones, and to respond to them with compassion.
- Bob Hall, a member of Courage since 1992, who will share his testimony of how Courage has helped him find faith, love, and community.

The presentations will be in English, with French simultaneous translation available for those who need it. There will be French and English small group discussions after each presentation, and opportunities for Q&A with the various speakers. Come either Thursday Oct 23, or Saturday Oct 25, from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM, at Saint-Boniface Cathedral Hall, 180 ave de la Cathédrale, Winnipeg. The same message will be shared each day.






