### January 11, 2026 – Baptism of the Lord



**“You are my Son, the Beloved; with whom I am well pleased.”**

In today's Gospel, we have the account of the baptism of Jesus by John. A heavenly voice declares him “my Beloved Son.” Like the other feasts of the Christmas season, the Baptism of the Lord is another chapter in the unfolding manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah sent by God. The focus of the readings this final day of the Christmas season is the inauguration of Jesus' public mission. The point is not just to learn something about the life of Jesus, but to shape our own lives ever more closely to the life that Jesus modelled for us and affirm that mission as our own. At our baptism, we were joined to the mission Christ publicly began at his own baptism. It is the beginning of each Christian's mission to serve as Jesus served. At each Eucharist, we renew our commitment to that mission. At the end of Mass, we are sent away by the familiar words: *“Let us go forth to love and serve the Lord”*.
