“Here is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world!”

Today's Scripture readings proclaim that Jesus' message is for the whole world, that it's universal. He fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah in the first reading, which says that God's servant will bring a message of salvation that must reach to the ends of the earth. St. Paul insists in his letter to the Corinthians that the Church that gathers there is not just a local church but is linked to a great worldwide network of churches, which he calls **“All the saints everywhere”**. John the Baptist proclaims Jesus as someone who forgives the sins of his own disciples but as the Lamb of God who “takes away the sins of the world”. As Christians, we can claim that Christ does offer a universal message of salvation, a unique revelation of truth. It depends on how we present this Gospel to others of no faith or of different faith.
