November 30, 2025: First Sunday of Advent



"Stay awake."

Today as we begin a new liturgical year, the liturgy invites us to come to the house of God, so that God may teach us his ways and help us walk in his light. Advent is like a spiritual wake up call to us, and has an awakening power. To awake spiritually means to be open and receptive, vigilant and active. It's

about understanding things, seeing things, hearing things. In other words, to be spiritually awake means to be attentive to God and others. It means to be living in love. Jesus urges us to stay awake, to be on our guard, to be on the watch. We have nothing to fear and everything to gain from answering Advent's wake up call. In today's first reading, Isaiah invites us to turn away from darkness and live in the light of the Lord. We can't do it without God. God has not left us alone. May we respond to His Son Jesus and walk in His ways, thus trying to be a copy of Christ – a witness of hope and love.

The rest of us usually take for granted that we will be around tomorrow. But when you start to look at each day as a gift, you realize all the little miracles that happen daily and you begin to see God's active presence in your life. You grow in gratitude for all that we have been given.

<u>Did You Know?</u> – Why purple during Advent? In liturgy, purple is the colour that represents conversion and giving of self. This colour reminds us that there is always more we can do to grow, to change and to be better.
