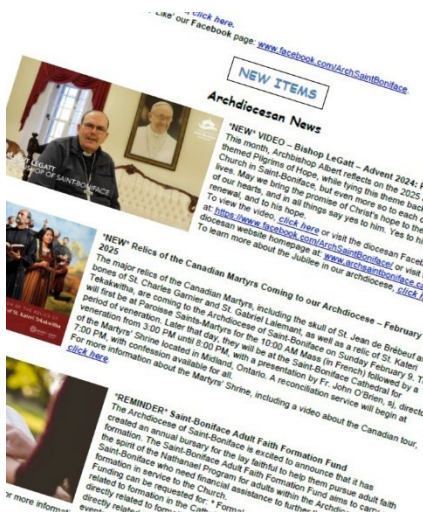

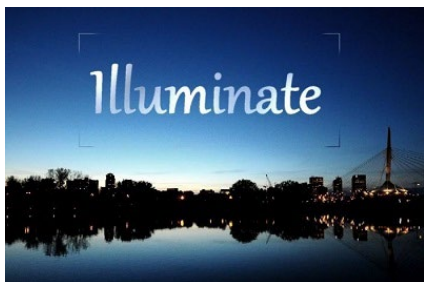

***UPDATED WITH NEW DATES!* CCRS OF MB – Unveiling the Gospels Bible Study 2026**

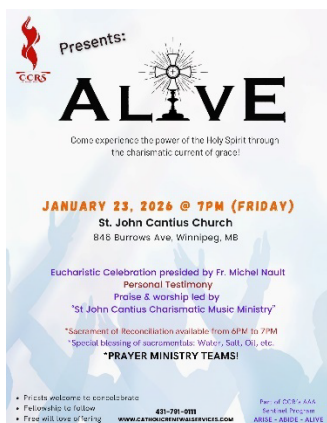

We are reminded that unity is a divine mandate at the core of our Christian identity, more than simply an ideal. This divine unity is central to our mission and is sustained by the profound love of Jesus Christ, who has set before us a unified purpose. As the Apostle Paul asserts in his letter to the Ephesians, "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling" (4:4). This Bible verse, chosen for the 2026 Week of Prayer, encapsulates the theological depth of Christian unity.

[Registration](#) is open for CCBP's 2026 Winnipeg Pro-life Bootcamp for high school students! Bootcamp consists in daily apologetics trainings, street outreach, and fun social time for the students!

This year's bootcamp runs March 30th to April 1st (three full days) during the spring break and will conclude with a family dinner on the last day to which all participants and their families will be invited. Most of the Bootcamp will *likely* be at Immanuel Christian School, with some of it *likely* being run at Youth For Christ in downtown Winnipeg.

Early Bird Deadline is January 17th and priced at \$175 per student (that includes meals, training, travel during camp, and chaperoned hotels).

Note: A Change from Previous Bootcamps

Some parents and teens might be interested to know that this year we are pivoting in our street outreach plans for the Bootcamp. After two excellent years of outreach at the University of Manitoba, the university students began to organize belligerent counterprotests and that meant our third Bootcamp last year was extra difficult for the bootcampers - they did so well, but the outreach environment was unideal for their learning, in my opinion. Some teens loved the battle vibes. Others found it a bit overwhelming, so we are going to change it up this year.

For 2026, we are going to have the Bootcamp street outreach take place *off* campus - with the hope to have it return to campus in future years - this year's outreach will be *mostly* door-to-door conversations, in residential areas, in trios (each trio including a CCBP mentor). Our team has extensive experience door-knocking and we know this will be pretty relaxed outreach.

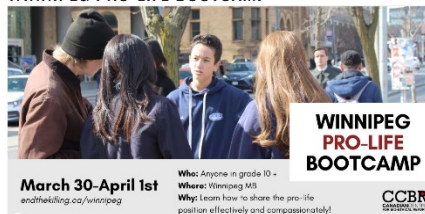

Released in late 2025, *Triumph of the Heart* tells the story of Maximilian Kolbe, the Saint of Auschwitz. St. Maximilian Kolbe was a priest, a writer, and a Catholic friar. During World War II, he was arrested and sent to Auschwitz for his vocal opposition to the ideologies of the day.

He watched as 10 men were condemned to die in the starvation bunker—a brutal death sentence. When one man cried out, “*My wife, my children!*” Kolbe stepped forward and offered his own life in exchange.
